APPLICATION INFORMATION

- Admission to the University is competitive. Applying early is encouraged as the University has the right to limit enrollment due to space availability in major programs and overall student capacity. An admission decision will not be made on your application until all required documents and fees are received.
 - All materials submitted to the University become its property. Documents will not be released to students nor will they be forwarded to other institutions or agencies.
 - Your application is only valid for the term you indicate on your application. If you are unable to attend and wish to be considered for a future term, you must contact the Office of Admissions and meet all deadlines for the term.
 - A social security number (SSN) is required for all students for federal reporting with specific exceptions as required by immigration law.* Once received, your SSN will be replaced by a random nine-digit identification number, your University ID (UID), which will be used for all university business. Your SSN will be stored in a single secured location as required by university policy.
- * International or undocumented students without a SSN may apply without providing a SSN and will be assigned a UID for all university business.

APPLICATION FEE INFORMATION

- Students are required to submit a \$40 nonrefundable application fee or apply for a fee waiver. Applicants who may qualify for an economic hardship waiver, veterans who served on active duty for a minimum of one year, and permanent employees and retirees of Illinois State University are exempt from paying the fee.
- Your application will not be processed until the \$40 application fee or fee waiver verification is received. The fee or waiver verification must be received by the required document deadline

of the term for which you are applying. The fee will not be returned to applicants who are denied admission or applicants who fail to submit the necessary information for an admission decision.

CRIMINAL ACTIVITY DISCLOSURE

Illinois State University is committed to maintaining a safe environment for all members of the University community. Therefore, applicants who are under current indictment of or have been convicted of a felony (this does not include routine traffic offenses, misdemeanors, or juvenile proceedings) are required to disclose this information as a mandatory step in the application process. A previous felony conviction or current indictment requires review by the University prior to an admission decision being made.

FIELDS OF STUDY REQUIRING ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Arts technology: Students should contact the arts technology advisor at (309) 438-3921 for additional information.

Music: Students are required to audition for formal admission into a music program. Call the School of Music at (309) 438-3566 to schedule an audition. Applicants must also submit an audition

Nursing (RN/ B.S.N.): Students must submit a copy of their Illinois nursing license. Applicants must also submit an application and a letter of recommendation to Mennonite College of Nursing. Beginning freshman

Application filing periods

Summer and fall 2010

Preferred filing period: September 1–November 15, 2009

*Application and required document deadline: March 1

Students applying and submitting all necessary transcripts and test scores during this time frame will be notified of an admission decision by December 31. Students applying and/or submitting all necessary transcripts and test scores between November 16 and March 1 will be notified of an admission decision by April 1. Applying early is encouraged, as the University has the right to limit enrollment due to space availability in major programs and overall student capacity.

Spring 2011

Preferred filing period: April 1–September 1, 2010

*Application and required document deadline: November 1, 2010

Spring admission for freshman standing students is limited. Students may be offered admission on a case-by-case basis as space permits.

Freshman admission

Admission decisions are not driven by the major chosen by the applicant.

Illinois State considers the following when making an admission decision:

- Grade point average
- ACT/SAT scores
- High school transcript (including grade trends and rigor of courses completed)
- Academic personal statement

The academic personal statement should be approximately 500 words and should address the following:

- a. State why you feel Illinois State University is a good fit for your educational goals
- b. Identify and explain your academic strengths and weaknesses
- c. Explain any circumstances which affected your high school academic performance, if applicable

Applicants must also show successful completion of the following:

- English—four years
- Mathematics—three years (algebra, geometry, algebra II)
- Natural Science—two years with laboratories
- Social Science—two years
- Foreign Language/Fine Arts—either two years of one foreign language or two years of fine arts
- Electives—two years

Deficiencies are not allowed in any subject area

Required documents:

- Application fee or verification of fee waiver
- High school transcript showing minimum of six semesters completed
- ACT or SAT score sent from the testing agency
Illinois State's ACT code: 1042, SAT code: 1319
- Academic personal statement
- GED scores if non-high school graduate

Transfer student

Application filing periods

Summer and fall 2010

Preferred filing period: September 1, 2009–January 1, 2010

*Application deadline: April 1

*Required document deadline: June 1

Spring 2011

Preferred filing period: April 1, 2010–August 1, 2010

*Application deadline: November 1

*Required document deadline: November 1

Spring admission for freshman standing transfer students (less than 24 semester hours completed at the time of enrollment) is limited. Students may be offered admission on a case-by-case basis as space permits.

Students are encouraged to apply early in the application filing period in order to have best consideration for admission to competitive majors. Students applying and submitting all necessary transcripts and required documents in the preferred filing period will be provided with the opportunity to participate in advanced course registration. Students applying or submitting required documents after the preferred filing period will be admitted as space permits on a rolling basis.

Transfer admission

Illinois State considers the following when making an admission decision:

- Cumulative college grade point average and (for some academic programs) prerequisite college coursework (view the Transfer/Readmit Major Admission Guide at www.Admissions.ilstu.edu/transfer/requirements) for these requirements
- Good academic standing at the last college attended
- If less than 24 college semester hours completed at the time of application, high school courses, grade point average, and ACT/SAT scores
- Proof of high school graduation or a passing score on the GED exam, if requested
- Optional: an academic personal statement explaining circumstances that affected collegiate academic performance

Remedial coursework will not be taken into consideration when calculating the admission GPA. An associate's degree does not guarantee admission.

Required documents:

- Official transcript from each college or university attended
- High school transcript if the student has less than 24 college semester hours completed at the time of application
- ACT or SAT score if the student has less than 24 college semester hours completed at the time of application

Students are encouraged to apply early in the application filing period in order to have best consideration for readmission, especially for majors with space limitations. Applying and submitting all necessary transcripts and required documents in the preferred filing period will provide students with the opportunity to participate in advanced course registration.

Readmission standards:

- Must have left the University in good academic standing
- Minimum 2.0 GPA required for all college coursework completed since leaving Illinois State, although many majors require higher GPA standards and prerequisite college coursework for admission. Visit www.Admissions.ilstu.edu/returning to view the Transfer/Readmit Major Admission Guide
- If on probation or dismissed, you may be considered for reinstatement or for the New Start readmission program. Supplemental information may be requested to determine eligibility. Visit www.Admissions.ilstu.edu/returning/ to learn more about readmission options

You will have the option to select a minor upon enrollment when meeting with an academic advisor.

Preprofessional programs are offered in dentistry, engineering, law, medicine, and veterinary medicine. Students must select a major in addition to specifying a preprofessional preparatory program. Biological sciences or chemistry are usually selected for health-related professions; preveterinary medicine under agriculture should be chosen for veterinary; engineering physics must be chosen for engineering; and law schools do not require a specific undergraduate major, although Illinois State's prelaw advisor is in the Department of Politics and Government. Preprofessional program advisors are available to assist with major and class selections.
